Front: Kopf des Marcus Antonius, vorn, und drapierte Büste der Octavia in der Brustansicht, dahinter, nebeneinander nach r.
Rear: Unter Segel stehendes Kriegsschiff (Galeere) nach r. Darüber Krummstab (lituus), darunter Wertzeichen A und Medusenkopf (?).
Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.
Inscribed upon (by hand): An object has been inscribed by hand with ink etc.
