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Description

Front: Kopf des Herakles mit Löwenfellxuvie nach r. Auf der Wange ein kleiner runder Gegenstempel mit Biene.

Rear: Zeus Aetophoros sitzt auf einem Thron nach l., in der l. Hand ein Zepter. Im l. F. ein Kranz. Unter dem Thron ΔΙ. Im l. F. (phönizisches?) Graffito.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.

Graffito: Lettering or similar mark incised into the surface of a coin that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin.
