Front: Doppelkopf des Janus mit Bart. Darunter das Wertzeichen.

Rear: Schiffsbug (prora) nach r.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.
